Using the toilet	Children will use designated toilets for their class and these will be <b>cleaned</b> thoroughly at midday and at the end of each day.			
Learning / curriculum	Education is not optional. # Learning spaces / classrooms

Classrooms will be cleaned / sanitised thoroughly at the end of each day and surfaces will be wiped down between groups using them.

Classrooms have been prepared in accordance with guidance to make them as safe as possible. This **includes** 

- removing unnecessary items from classrooms and other learning environments where there is space to store it elsewhere
- removing soft furnishings, soft toys and toys that are hard to clean (such as those with intricate parts)

Classrooms will be well-ventilated.

Toys / equipment / laptops etc will be available for specific children and cleaned at the end of the day.

Classrooms are organised with children sitting side-to-side and facing the front as per our risk assessment.

There is no need for class sizes to be adjusted from the usual size.

Each child will be provided with the equipment they will need to complete their tasks. Shared equipment will be wiped down between groups / classes as necessary.

Children should bring back all reading books, laptops and any other equipment they might have had at home when they return on 8<sup>th</sup> March.

Pupils and teachers can take books and other shared resources home as necessary, although unnecessary sharing should be avoided.

Online homework for the majority of our children will continue as per the Autumn term as you have been so fantastic engaging with the remote learning.



This is a regular part of our daily routine and specifically after using the toilet and before/after eating and after going outside.

Increased hand washing can lead to dry skin and parents may wish to explore using hand cream at home. Only medically prescribed hand-cream can be used by children in school which they must administer themselves.



Children will have their usual break time with their class and these will be staggered. Children will












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Lunch time	access outside space on a rota and we aim to maximise the use of outdoor space as often as we can. If we are lucky to enjoy hot sunny days please ensure children have applied sun cream before coming to school. Children can also bring named hats which cannot be shared for safety reasons.  Children will eat in the dining room – timings to be staggered. Lunch tables will be wiped clean between sittings. As usual, any child can bring a packed lunch from home. If a school meal is needed:  Nursery £1 for a lunch provided by the kitchen (this will be eaten in their classroom). If you do not want your child to stay for lunch please contact to school office to arrange an earlier collection time.  Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 – Universal Free School meal provided by the kitchen.  Other year groups – school meals from the kitchen £2.20.  Free School Meals – provided by the kitchen as usual.
